





### COORDINATED PATROLS ALONG IMBL ANDAMAN SEA





- •White shipping information refers to exchange of relevant advance information on the identity and movement of commercial non-military merchant vessels.
- India currently has signed
- 15 agreements on White Shipping

## •Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR)

- material and logistic short-term assistance until the long-term help by government and other institutions replaces it.



## Humanitarian Activities and Disaster Relief Operations by India: A decade in HADR

- •Tsunami (Dec 2004): Assistance to Maldives, Indonesia and Sri Lanka by deploying 27 Ships and over 5,000 personnel deployed within 36 hours
- •Cyclone SIDR hit Bangladesh (Nov 2007): Four Ships, Gharial, Mahish, Cheetah, Kumbhir deployed
- •Cyclone *NARGIS* hit Myanmar (May 2008): Two ships, Rana and Kirpan deployed
- •Cyclone *PHAILIN* (Oct 2013): Diving and Rescue teams deployed
- •Operation *NEER* (Dec 2014): Special Task Force deployed to Maldives
