# 6. Arrival and Departure Arrangements

6.1. It is the responsibility of all participants to arrange their own airport transfers. Taxi and shuttle information for Auckland Airport can be found here.

## 7. Visa and Customs Requirements

- 7.1. **Visas:** All participants are required to arrive with a valid passport and visa. Participants are kindly reminded to check with the New Zealand High Commission/Embassy in their country in relation to visa matters. ### 8. Dress Code

- 8.1. The recommended dress code for each event is as follows:
  - Defence Officials' Dialogue (7 May): business attire/military uniform.
  - Official Dinner for the DOD (7 May): smart casual<sup>1</sup> or national dress.
  - ARF ISG on CBMs and PD (8 9 May): business attire.
  - Official Dinner (8 May): business attire, smart casual or national dress.

9.2. **Electricity:** Mains voltage in New Zealand is 230/240V 50Hz. Travellers from most nations in Asia should have appliances that work on the same mains voltage as New Zealand - therefore you will not need a voltage converter. Notable exceptions to this are Japan and USA which use 100/120V 50/60Hz. If your country does not use appliances within the 230V 50Hz mains voltage range, you may need to purchase a voltage converter.



- 9.3. **Weather:** Between May and September, the 'cold' weather months in New Zealand, you will need warm clothing for the days, evenings and nights. The average May temperatures for Auckland range from 11°C 17 °C. The meeting venue will be temperature controlled.
- 9.4. Foreign Currency Exchange: Banks are commonly open on Monday through Friday from 0930 to 1600. Foreign currency exchanges can be found throughout the city centre and at Auckland Airport. Major international credit cards are widely accepted. Automated Teller Machines (ATMs) are found throughout the city.
- 9.5. **Designated Smoking Areas:** New Zealand has strict laws that prohibit smoking indoors. Please use designated smoking areas outside.
- 9.6. Medical: Medical issues are the responsibility of each participant. The Ministry of Defence and Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade assumes no responsibility for the provision of medical treatment should it be necessary during the meeting. Medical costs in New Zealand may be considered expensive for visitors. Travel Insurance provided by either your Government Service or personal insurance is recommended.
- 9.7. Emergency: <u>Call 111 in emergencies</u>. In New Zealand, the number to call if you need the Police, Fire service, or an ambulance in an emergency is 111. You can call this number on a mobile phone even if the phone is out of credit. The operator will ask you which service you need and connect you to the right service.
- 9.8. **Spouse program:** There will not be a spouse program
