



Pakistan's commitment towards promoting International peace and prosperity stems from the vision of its Founding Father

- Imperative for the peace keepers to have a thorough understanding of host country environment













- Pakistan has played a significant role as a member of the United Nations

- Today, Pakistan's position as one of the largest Troop Contributing Country in the world is testimony to its commitment and endeavors towards promoting the noble cause of global peace





Factors Kept in Mind before Training

- Capabilities should be mission specific owing to the prevailing environments of the host country
- Terrain & weather conditions
- > Economic / social dynamics of populace
- Law and order situation
- Mandate authorized by the UN Security Council to the specific UN mission for the host country
- Requirement of capacity building of law enforcement agencies of host country
- Preparedness & logistics sustainment


Selection / Organization of the Unit

- Every country has its own organization, however, for each UN Peace Keeping mission Infantry Battalion organization will differ based upon: -
 - Mission / Operational requirement
 - TCC capabilities
 - MOU between UN & TCC
 - Type of UN mandate i.e Peace Keeping or Peace Enforcement Mission





- Selection of Manpower As per dictates of the mission especially Battalion leadership and personnel is vital for effective performance
- **Reconnaissance of the Mission Area**














































































