

#### **HACGAM**

Conduct cooperative arrangements around four 'pillars': Search and Rescue; Environmental Protection; Preventing and Controlling Unlawful Acts at Sea; and Capacity Building to promote safe and secure shipping in the region

#### **IORA**

To expand mutually beneficial cooperation in the Indian Ocean region through a consensus-based approach on Maritime Safety and Security, Trade and Investment Facilitation, Fisheries Management, Disaster Risk Management, Academic Science and Technology Cooperation and Tourism and Cultural Exchanges.

#### **IOFMC / HONIOR**

To facilitate between drug/law enforcement agencies in the region, along with relevant international organisations, coordination and collaboration in counter-narcotics initiatives targeting the southern Indian Ocean trafficking route. Priority areas included maritime drug enforcement capacity-building, illicit financial flows and the Dhow Project.

#### **ReCAAP**

To enhance regional co-operation through information sharing, capacity building and cooperative arrangements in combating piracy and armed robbery against ships and to be the information hub for combating piracy and armed robbery against Ships in Asia.

## **EAS**

To promote dialogue and cooperation for key challenges facing the East Asian Region such as terrorism and violent extremism, the South China Sea, the Korean Peninsula, irregular migration and human trafficking, and regional trade agreements, whilst driving closer regional integration.
