

Defining Security Architecture

 Structure of relations that are geared towards facilitating cooperation, defining expectations of appropriateness, and engaging all states regardless of size

Buzan on Asia Pacific Security Architecture

Recent developments that need to be taken into consideration are

- the relative empowerment of China in relation to its neighbors
- the growth of regional institutions
- the attachment of security significance to East Asian economic developments, in merging the security dynamics of Northeast and Southeast Asia
- how China relates to its East Asian region, and how the US and China relate to each other
- Internal developments within China and the US
- the basic dynamic of interstate relations in East Asia is more defined by the Westphalian principle of balancing, or by the bandwagoning imperative more characteristic of suzerain-vassal relationships.
