Concept Paper ASEAN Regional Forum Workshop on Emergency Management of Offshore Oil Spill

Background

1.Pursuant to *ARF marine oil spill prevention, preparedness, response and recovery cooperation declaration* approved by ARF Foreign Ministers' Meeting in 2014, the workshop, as the follow-up activity and achievement of 2013 ARF Intersessional Meeting on Maritime Security, aims to promote information and knowledge sharing and regional cooperation in the field of marine oil spill response, so as to promote the establishment of expert network of marine oil spill emergency response contributing to the sustainable development of regional maritime economy.

Topics

2. Technical exchanges and discussions are carried out in three topics to identify hot spots and urgent problems.

Topic 1: The drift forecasting and environmental behavior of marine oil spill

Topic 2: Monitoring, identification and assessment of marine oil spill and oil spill restoration

Topic 3: Emergency response of the marine oil spill

Topic 4: Establishment of regional expert network of marine oil spill emergency response

3.Each ARF participant is expected to send up to 2-3 representatives from government authorities, agencies or business to the workshop. Experts from certain relevant

international organizations will also be invited to the workshop. Attendants will speak in their own capacity at the workshop and are not on behalf of their respective government or institution.

4. The 2-day workshop is to be held in 29-30th October, 2015 in Qingdao, China,by the North China Sea Branch, State Oceanic Administration. English will be the working language.
