

European Union and ASEAN Regional Forum cooperation on disaster relief and humanitarian assistance

EU and ARF members can benefit from increased collaboration on disaster management, building on the good cooperation already in place

Cooperation between regional mechanisms such as the European Union's Civil Protection Mechanism and the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance (AHA Centre) is crucial

The EU is committed to supporting the 2016-2020 ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER) work programme, as well as the ASEAN Emergency Response Mechanisms

The 4 priorities of ECHO Disaster Preparedness Strategy in Asia

- Shock responsive service provision and social protection (the integration of contingencies and preparedness arrangements into locally owned basic service delivery and social protection for vulnerable populations)
- Forecast based early actions (to develop national and local competencies for early action)
- Disaster preparedness in urban settings (supporting methodological development and local competencies in preparedness for response and early action in <u>urban areas</u>, particularly in megacities)
- Emergency preparedness for response (to increase humanitarian preparedness for response and Emergency Response Mechanisms (ERMs))



ECHO Humanitarian Response in ASEAN countries




In 2018, ECHO Asia & Pacific supported humanitarian response to 5 disasters through international partners in 4 countries: Laos (1), Philippines (2) and Indonesia (2)

European Union Civil Protection Mechanism

When the scale of an emergency overwhelms national response capacities, the **EU Civil Protection Mechanism** enables a coordinated assistance from the Participating States.





Participating countries include

EU Member States



Iceland, Norway, Serbia, North Macedonia. Montenegro, and Turkey Civil protection legislation provides for:

Cooperation in prevention and preparedness

Effective disaster response

Reinforced joint training and exercises of civil protection experts

Rapid deployment via voluntary pool of national crisis response assets

EU Civil Protection Mechanism Activation

Natural or man-made **disaster** inside or outside the EU



Affected country requests assistance from the Mechanism through the **Emergency Response Coordination** Centre (ERCC)





Once the affected country has accepted the offers...

Participating states

offer assistance, such as personnel and equipment



EU Civil Protection Mechanism is activated



...ERCC coordinates

the deployment and delivery of assistance ERCC may deploy a team of EU Civil **Protection** experts



Assistance delivered. experts return.





EU cooperation with the AHA Centre – an example of Regional Mechanisms for Disaster Management and International Coordination

Building on the already good cooperation between the EU and the AHA Centre is very important, and the Support AHA Project is a prime example of deepening these links

EU Civil Protection Agencies are currently answering a Call for Proposals to strengthen EU-ASEAN collaboration on Disaster Management through sharing expertise, skills and experience
