#### **UNTAC (CAMBODIA)**

- Total of 1002 officers and men from Bangladesh
- Difficulty faced in Mission area :
  - ✓ Inaccessibility
  - ✓ Poor road network
  - ✓ Lack of communication facility
  - ✓ Non-availability of required
  - Language barrier



#### <u>UNTAC</u> (CAMBODIA)

- Khemr Rouge attacked camps, posts and convoys several times
- Strong persuasion to implement cease-fire / surrender weapons

- □ Two contingents participated 1993-1995

- □ Bangladeshi peacekeepers more acceptable

- □ BANBAT ensured safe passage

- Rugged mountainous terrain of Bosnia
- People tenacious and tough fighters
- EU nations and USA perplexed
- Extreme weather
- Ruthless and better-equipped Serbs




#### <u>Unprofor</u> (former Yugoslavia)

- Encircled our contingents for months together
- Closed all supply routes

#### <u>unamsil</u> (Sierra Leone)

- In 1999 India and Jordan withdrew their troops
- Bangladesh's commitment helped UNAMSIL to flourish again
- Overwhelming influence followed by the visit of its President to Bangladesh

- Ensured UN presence in the remote areas





#### **BANGLADESH POLICE**
