ANNEX 5: Closing Remarks by Korea National Defense University President, LTG. Park, Sam Duck

There were different methods presented in this meeting regarding further institutionalization of the Defense University's meeting. If we could accomplish an unanimous agreement on the specifics of this method at the next meeting in Myanmar, this would further enhance the quality and level of our meeting.

Once again, I convey my appreciation to each nation's top delegates for their great ideas at this meeting, and this meeting, I believe, has greatly contributed to fortifying the basis of stability in the Asian-Pacific region and world peace, as well as to the promotion of mutual understanding and trust among member state.

The official meeting ends today with the farewell banquet that shall be hosted by the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Armed Forces of the Republic of Korea. Though we part in firm belief of the day we meet again, I trust that the contents of our discussion here shall become the vital roots of peace and stability in the Asian-Pacific region.

Culture tours are planned for tomorrow. Through your visit to Panmunjeom, you may see for yourself the reality of Korea's national security. Also, during your visit to KINTEX you may witness Korea's state of the art defense industry and Gyeongbokgung Palace will show you the beauty of our tradition.
