PROPOSAL FOR ASEAN PKC NETWORK:



Short-Term:

- a. Information sharing on peacekeeping training curriculum, training materials and training methodology.
- b. Establish a network that links peacekeeping centre among ASEAN Member States.
- c. Identify gaps and priorities in the development of ASEAN peacekeeping capacities and capabilities.
- d. Assist ASEAN Member States that are planning to develop their own peacekeeping centers in building capacities and capabilities in peacekeeping.



PROPOSAL FOR ASEAN PKC NETWORK:



Medium-Term:



a. Establish and develop Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) to guide the implementation of the network.



b. Exchange of expertise, visits among instructors, trainers and trainees of peacekeeping centers and other relevant bodies in the region.



c. Develop common peacekeeping training, operations and best practices manuals as reference for ASEAN Peacekeeping Centers Network.



d. Commence Joint training.



PROPOSAL FOR ASEAN PKC NETWORK:



Long-Term:



a. Establish formal framework for collaboration among Member States in developing a common standby arrangement to support peacekeeping operations.



b. Enhance interoperability of peacekeeping forces among ASEAN Member States.



c. Develop existing peacekeeping centers within ASEAN Member States into centers of excellence in specialized areas of peacekeeping.



d. Combine Peacekeeping Operation Contingent
