




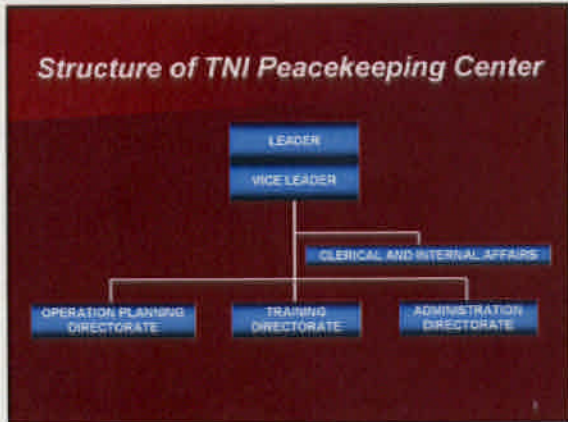

History of TNI Peacekeeping Center in Brief

- ❑ Indonesia formally became the 50th member of UN on 28 Sept '50
- ❑ Resigned from the membership of UN on 7 Jan '65
- ❑ Again became member of UN on 28 Sept '66
- ❑ First involvement in PKO on 8 Jan '67 (United Nation Emergency Force in Sinal, Egypt)
- ❑ TNI PKC establishment on 29 Jan '07




Vision :
Contribute professionals in peacekeeping to participate in various UN PKO

Mission :
To conduct Training on Peacekeeping Operations, as well as organizing seminars and conferences related to UN Peacekeeping matters

- Capabilities :**
- Carry out Pre Deployment Training on Peace Keeping Operations on regular and requirements basis
 - Organizing as well as sponsoring all types of UN seminar and conferences
 - Conduct training exercises on Peace Support Operations at local level (International level-limited)
 - Conduct Peace Support Training package at various training institutions outside TNI PKC when requested.
 - Provide training assistance either to civilian or police when requested

A Glimpse Training :

Concept : Complexity of UN mission; dynamic of conflict –Provide Generic Training as well as other relevant subject to expedite the task

Pre Deployment Training

1. Task Force/ Contingent members :

Aim : To prepare personnel to work as member of military task force or contingent in Peace keeping Operation

Objectives : upon completion of the training personnel should be able to :

- Understand the current situation in the mission area
- Undertake UN peacekeeping technique as part of their military contingent
- Carry out international escort
- Understand general safety, security and logistic aspect of a military contingent
- Understand media management in accordance with UN policy
- Acquire knowledge and skills on handling of GPS
- Be able to analyze different situation, cultural aspect, code of conduct and gender issues in the mission area
- Etc

The Training is conducted once a year

Duration :

One month

2. Military Observers and Military Staff :

Aim : To train the officers so as to enable them to perform the duties of UN Military Observer and UN Staff Officer in the UN field environment

Objectives: Upon Completion of the training, all officers will

- * Be familiar with UN in general, UN organization, UN charter, universal declaration of human rights
- * Understand negotiation, liaison and mediation, media management, mine awareness, first aid, hygiene and sanitation
- * Be able to execute investigation and verification, observation, monitoring and patrolling.

- *Acquire knowledge and skills on handling of GPS, Computer, Driving and communication.
- *Be able to analyze different situation, cultural aspect, code of conduct and gender in mission area.
- *Understand staff duties : G-1 to G-9
