Mine Clearance Achievement in the past three years

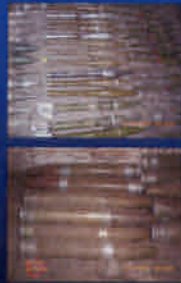
Area Cleared: 57,615,622 m²

Humanitarian Aid in Sudan



- Distributed cleaned water to Indian level 2 hospital, Sudanese Hospital and Sudanese civilians in Malakal in the amount of 48,725 m³
- Distributed drinking water to UNMIS, UNMAO, UNMIS multi-nations in the amount of 1,278,682 liters. For UN costs is equal to 4,997,352 USD.
- Help to Construct road with Indian Army equal to 1,500 m and help to build 09 new homes for poor Sudanese civilians

PEACEKEEPING OPERATIONS

FOR UNITED NATIONS IN HUMANITARIAN MISSIONS

Participated in Multi-nations Exercises

- Mongolia (2007): 44 personnel
- Bangladesh (2008): 41 personnel
- Indonesia (2009): 60 personnel
- Mongolia (2009): 45 personnel

- Cambodia fully obtained prosperity with security and peace due to the implementation of the **WIN WIN Strategy** of the Royal Government of Cambodia including political stability and a reunification among political factions with the unity armed forces called the Royal Cambodian Armed Forces.

LESSON LEARNT FOR CAMBODIAN PKO

- Obtained a good experience during UNTAC era in 1991
- Respected the sovereignty of the host nation (Sudan)
- Made a good cooperation with other countries to seek peace for Sudanese citizen
- Strictly obeyed the rules and regulations of the United Nations

LESSON LEARNT FOR CAMBODIAN PKO

- Before sending troop to the mission area, we trained soldiers to adapt to the geography conditions of the host country
- During an operation, we made a good cooperation with local authority and civilians
- Besides, mine clearance, we did humanitarian assistance such as provided cleaned and drinking water, medical consultation, distribution of food

Future Peacebuliding

- Based on Cambodia past experience, we do hope that the struggle world can live with harmony with other nations as family, neighbor and community friend.
- As one nation who loves peace but can't obtain peace and no future, how can she survive?

Big Opportunity for Cambodia

- Year 2010, Cambodia will host the multi-nations exercise under the name "**ANGKOR SENTINEL**" under the United Nations guidelines and in cooperation with USPACOM.
- This exercise will follow UN Humanitarian Standard
