# The International Humanitarian Landscape

- Transitioning and undergoing significant shifts: new and emerging stakeholders
- Regional organizations and governments taking lead role in preparedness and response
- Alignment of international efforts with regional and national priorities for preparedness and capacity development, in particular in high-risk countries
- Changing resource mobilization and financing environment



### Post-2015 Scenario: The Humanitarian System in 2025

#### Influenced by 3 drivers:

- Digital revolution and technology
- Growth of cash transfer programming; and
- Role of the private sector

#### **Characteristics**

Changing political-social-economic dynamics, defined by inclusivity, multiple overlapping structures with new players, shifts in global power and geopolitics, increased role of civil society and local responders, shared reporting mechanisms, common data platforms and more sophisticated forward purchasing capacities.

#### **Multi-Sectoral Response**

A multi-faceted, multi-disciplinary, multi-sectoral approach is a sine qua non in addressing preparedness and early response, and in setting the basis for establishing coordination mechanisms to achieve substantial reduction of disaster losses in the region.

## **Evolving Regional Architecture on Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief**


- Signing of the ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER) in July 2005, and its entry into force in December 2009, spearheaded by the ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management (ACDM)
- Re-convening of ARF ISM on DR in December 2005 following the 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami
- ASEAN Leaders in 2009 tasking the SG of ASEAN as the ASEAN Humanitarian Assistance Coordinator for both natural disasters and pandemics
- Establishment of the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance (AHA Centre) in November 2011 as the operational coordination engine under the AADMER, working closely with SG of ASEAN particularly in large-scale disasters
- Establishment of the ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting (ADMM) Plus in 2010 and the expansion of the East Asia Summit (EAS) in 2011, both have put HADR as a priority area







On Friday, 8 Nov 2013, Super Typhoon Haiyan made its landfall at 04:00 AM at the Visayas area and caused massive destructions

- Mandate: High-level coordination in large-scale disasters
- <u>Mechanisms</u>: Going beyond the current disaster management mechanisms
- Resource Mobilisation: Mobilising resources from within and outside ASEAN
- Partnership Building: Garnering support from external partners
- Communication Strategy: Making ASEAN's efforts more visible
- <u>Capacity Building:</u> Enhancing institutional capacity to support multi-sectoral responses
- Monitoring and Evaluation: Enhancing results-based management, and accountability to AMS, donors and stakeholders

### **Latest Activities**

- Secretary-General of ASEAN as the Humanitarian Assistance Coordinator
  - TOR to formalize high-level coordination and facilitation to deal with community-wide, crosssectoral response
- Joint Task Force to Promote Synergy with other Relevant ASEAN Bodies on Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief
  - Promote synergy and coordination among the relevant internal ASEAN HADR mechanisms (AMMDM, ADMM, ADMM-Plus, ARF, and EAS)
