Threats

- Terrorism (WMD "most frightening scenario")
- Proliferation of WMD ("potentially the greatest threat to our security")
- Regional conflicts ("Regional insecurity can fuel the demand for WMD")
- State failure (link to org.crime, terrorism)
- Organized crime (including cross-border trafficking in arms, links to terrorism)



EUGS: shared interests

- Peace and security for citizens and territory
- Prosperity: promoting growth, jobs, equality, safe and healthy environment
- Democracy: human rights, fundamental freedoms, rule of law, justice, solidarity, equality, non-discrimination, pluralism, respect for diversity
- A rules-based global order



EUGS: global order

- A rules-based global order
- Multilateralism as key principle, UN at its core
- Grounded in international law, incl. the UN Charter and Universal Decl. of Human Rights
- Agreed rules to contain power politics and contribute to a peaceful, fair and prosperous world with open economies and deep global connections



EUGS: priorities

- Security and defence
- Counter-terrorism
- Cyber security
- Energy security
- State and societal resilience
- Enlargment and neighbourhood policies
- Integrated approach to conflicts and crises



Principles of response

- Address root causes of insecurity & instability
- Effective multilateralism:
- Support universalisation and effective implementation of treaties and agreements
- Support relevant multilateral institutions
- National and coordinated export controls
- Non-proliferation to be mainstreamed into overall policies, all resources and instruments



EU Institutions

- European Council Heads of State and Govt.
- Foreign Affairs Council (FAC) Ministers
- Political and Security Committee (PSC) Amb.
- PSC Working Parties: CONOP, COARM, etc.
- RELEX Committee (on sanctions, projects)
- European Parliament, esp. SEDE and AFET
- European Commission, various DGs: DEVCO, HOME, JRC, ECHO, ENER, etc. EUROATOM



Tools and instruments

- Statements and public declarations
- Diplomatic demarches (via EU Delegations)
- Political dialogues and partnerships
- NP clauses in partnership & coop. agreements
- Joint Actions > Council Decisions
- Other financial instruments and programmes
- Sanctions (UNSC Resolutions, EU autonomous)
- Negotiations (EU/E3+3 with Iran > JCPoA)



EU Statements

- Declarations of policy, reactions to current developments, case- or forum-specific
- Drafted and agreed at 28, also by EUDELs
- At various levels: European Council (Heads of State and Government), Foreign Affairs Council (Foreign Ministers), EU officials
- Various fora: UN, CD, IAEA GC, OPCW EC etc.
- Open to alignments by non-EU States



Demarches

- Established diplomatic tool now used by EU
- To present a position and encourage or discourage certain action or behaviour
- Terms of Reference developed and approved
- Delivered via a network of EU Delegations and Member States' Embassies (Presidency)
- On NPD in 2018: 6 demarches to 60 countries
- Examples: ATT, A-CPPNM, CTBT, HCoC, UNSCR.




Financial instruments

- Variety of EU financial instruments: Instr. contributing to Stability and Peace (IcSP);
 Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) budget (EU MS unanimity needed), others
- Joint Actions > Council Decisions: since 2004
 92 projects worth ca 240 MEUR of which ca
 38% for nuclear, 25% SALW, 11% chemical and
 9% for arms export control capacity-building
- Supporting: UNODA,IAEA,OPCW,OSCE,BAFA...



CFSP/NPD growth


€ committed/year for NPD Council Decisions 2014-2018

 Organization (CTBTO) in order to strengthen
 its monitoring and verification capabilities
- Budget: EUR 4,594,752 over 24 months

CDs from 2018

Council Decision (CFSP) 2018/1939 of 10
 December 2018 on Union support for the universalisation and effective implementation of the International Convention for the Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism

- Budget: EUR 4,999,986 over 36 months

CDs from 2018

 Council Decision (CFSP) 2019/538 of 1 April 2019 in support of activities of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW)

- Budget: EUR 11 601 256 over 36 months

EU CD(CFSP) 2017/809

- the 5th consecutive EU Council Decision in support of the proper implementation of UNCR 1540; 2.7 m EURO over a period of 3 years (until 2020)
- Recent meetings UNSCR 1540 national capacity building workshop in Lomé, Togo (23 January 2019) and training course in Addis Ababa (26-28 March 2019) for African Union English speaking MSs National POCs
