#### Criminal

(proliferation, theft, sabotage and illicit trafficking),

#### Accidental

(industrial catastrophes, in particular chemical or nuclear, waste treatment, transport),

#### Natural

(mainly pandemics).






#### **Regional Secretariats**

- South East Europe, Southern Caucasus, Moldova and Ukraine (Georgia).





# Needs Assessment Questionnaire (NAQ)










 Helps to assess current national CBRN risk mitigation capacities and identify needs

NAQ

- Undertaken by the National CBRN Team
- Enables data collection and needs prioritization
- Enables Project Proposals development
- Basis for National CBRN Action Plan
- Self-assessment of Partner Country (PC) with support of the European Commission (EC)
- Voluntary basis













# National Action Plan (NAP)









- Voluntary.
- National authorities have ownership.
- Support from experts if desired.
- Coordination with regional and international organization and existing instruments.
- Objectives:
- facilitate coherent & effective approach to CBRN capacity building.

National CBRN TEAM has a key role to play in the process











The National CBRN Action Plan will be produced in coordination with existing instruments and activities, including:



- Integrated Nuclear Security Support Plan (INSSP) of IAEA
- National Action Plan to fulfill UNSCR 1540 (in coordination
  with UNSCR 1540 Committee, UNODA and OSCE)
  - WHO Protocol for Assessing National Surveillance and Response Capacities for the International Health Regulations
  - OPCW Action Plan on chemical safety and security
  - INTERPOL CBRNE Terrorism Prevention Programme and


