


Security of key waterways


Straits of Malacca and Singapore (SOMS)

- 40% of world trade
- 15 million barrels of oil per day
- >50,000 ships per year


Major disruption in the SOMS will lead to serious cause for concern for Asian economies and global trade

- Navigational disruptions (collisions, oil spills)
- Security disruptions (piracy and sea robberies, terrorism)






Piracy and sea robbery situation in the SOMS



Security of our port and port waters

Coordinated efforts with security and enforcement agencies


- Multi-agency approach for smooth implementation of security measures:
 - Prohibited areas around sensitive installations
 - Designated routes for regional ferries and leisure craft
 - Designated landing points to facilitate customs and immigration
 - 24/7 Maritime Surveillance, Presence and Boarding Operations
- Formation of Task Forces, Committees and Working Groups to address different aspects of maritime security

Coordinated regional response

Straits of Malacca and Singapore – consensus on 3 principles:

Primary responsibility for security of the Straits lies with littoral States



- International community, including user States & the International Maritime Organization, has a role to play
- 3 New measures should be developed in line with international law and with respect for national sovereignty

Malacca Strait Patrols

- Malacca Straits Sea Patrols (MSSP) launched in 2004
- 'Eyes in the Sky' maritime air patrols launched in 2005 Indo-Sin Coordinated Patrol
