Thailand Maritime Laws Enforcement Mechanism

THAI-MECC (Plan), and Maritime Security Policy and Strategy, Naval Operations Department

Thailand Maritime Enforcement Mechanism Center

- There are several maritime law enforcement agencies, with different jurisdictions, powers, and area of responsibilities.
- To optimise the use of maritime forces
- To maximise the effectiveness of law enforcement
- Inter-government agencies coordination is needed

Thailand Maritime Enforcement Coordinating Center



National Security Council approved the establishment of the THAI-MECC in 1997

Challenges: THAI-MECC 18 Years On

- Ad-Hoc Organisation
- Only Coordinating Power
- Lack Tactical Control over the maritime forces in the operating area
- Lack of a single manager
- In need of an integration body

Change is on the way

Thailand Maritime Security Strategy 2015 - 2021

- Endorsed by the cabinet in October 2014, and the National Assembly in January 2015
- Key area is to upgrade the Thai MECC to
- Thailand Maritime Enforcement Administrating Center
- With 3 regional operations centers

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Thai Prevention and Suppression of Piracy Act 1991

- Piracy is punishable under Thai Penal Code
- Terminology of piracy extended to include armed robbery against ship, committed on the high seas
- As the piracy activities increased in the second half of 1980s, Thai government enacted "Prevention and Suppression of Piracy Act 1991" Based on the provision of UNCLOS1982
- Prosecution under Thai Penal Court
- Prosecution arrangement: None / Thai Court

Ratification of UNCOS 1982

- United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea
- Signature: 10/12/1982
- Ratified: 15/05/2011
