

■Specific Objectives of the Plan of Action

- Develop a more cohesive, regional strategy aimed at preventing, controlling and neutralizing transnational crime;
- Foster regional cooperation at the investigative, prosecutorial, and judicial level as well as the rehabilitation of perpetrators;
- Enhance coordination among ASEAN bodies dealing with transnational crime;
- Strengthen regional capacities and capabilities to deal with sophisticated nature of transnational crime; and
- Develop sub-regional and regional treaties on cooperation in criminal justice, including mutual legal assistance and extradition.

ASEAN Convention on Counter Terrorism

- Framework for regional co-operation to counter, prevent, and suppress terrorism in all its forms and manifestations and to deepen co-operation among law enforcement agencies and relevant authorities of the Parties in Countering terrorism.
- Enhance Cooperation and intelligence exchange
- ■Treaty on Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters
 - Improve and facilitate cooperation of law enforcement authorities in resolving criminal matters

■ASEAN Agreement on Customs

"Customs authorities shall endeavour to cooperate with each other and with relevant agencies for the protection of the ASEAN community through concrete actions in combating customs fraud, offences and any transnational crime, including but not limited to illicit drugs trafficking, intellectual property rights (IPR), money laundering, terrorism, and human trafficking"

- Contracting parties communicate information regarding incidents of piracy or armed robbery through one office (the focal point)

■ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting (ADMM), March 2015

- *Cooperate to counter the imminent threat of terrorist organizations by increasing public awareness"
- Endorsed the Standard Operating Procedure for the Utilisation of Military Assets for Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief under the ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response

■Chairman's Statement of the 5th East Asia Summit Foreign Minister's Meeting, Kuala Lumpur, 6 August 2015

- "The Ministers highlighted the need for countries to support efforts to counter terrorist and violent extremist ideology and propaganda"
- *The Ministers underscored the importance of peace and stability in the region and reiterated the Leaders' call for regional efforts to enhance cooperation in promoting maritime safety and security."

■Plan of Action

- Strengthen the rule of law and border control among ASEAN Member States:
- Intensify efforts to prosecute trafficking in persons cases; and
- *Strengthen regional cooperation based on shared responsibilities to effectively address demand and supply that fosters all forms of trafficking in persons, especially women and children, that leads to trafficking.
