- FOUR MAIN PRINCIPLES : 1- RESPECT & EQUALITY, 2- MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING & TRUST, 3- SHARING WEAL & WOE, 4- OPENNESS, INCLUSIVENESS, SOLIDARITY & COOPERATION.
