
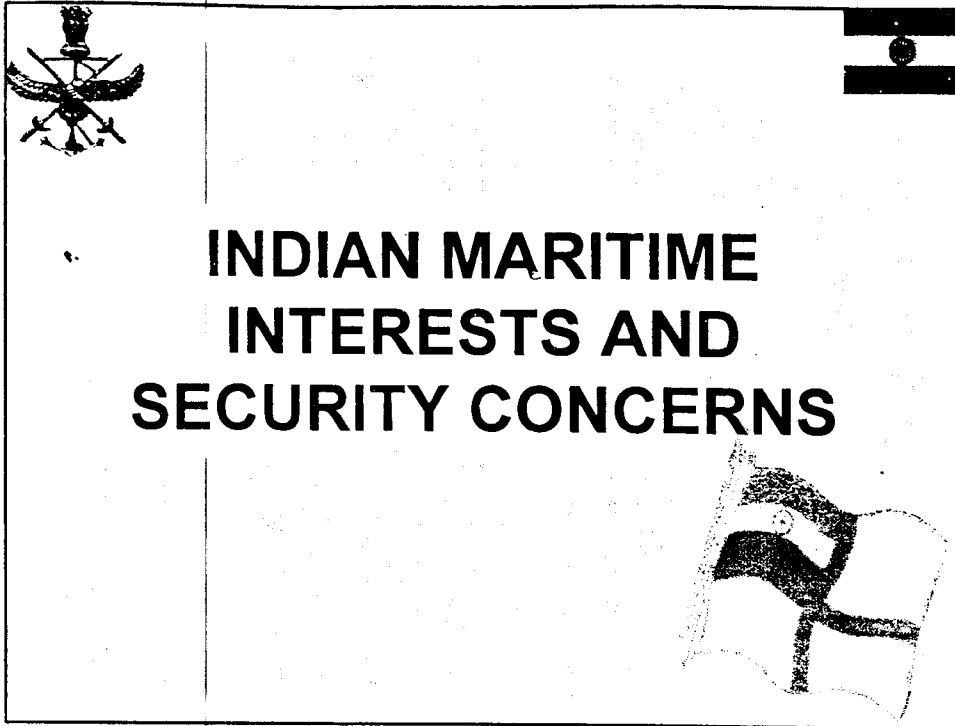

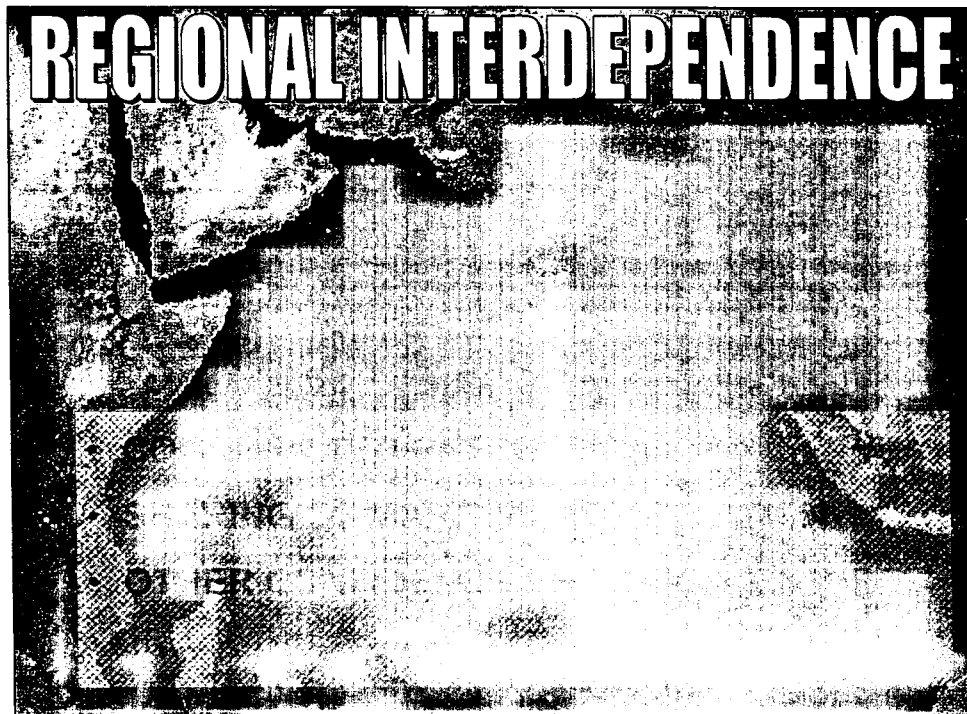
SEA LANES OF COMMUNICATION

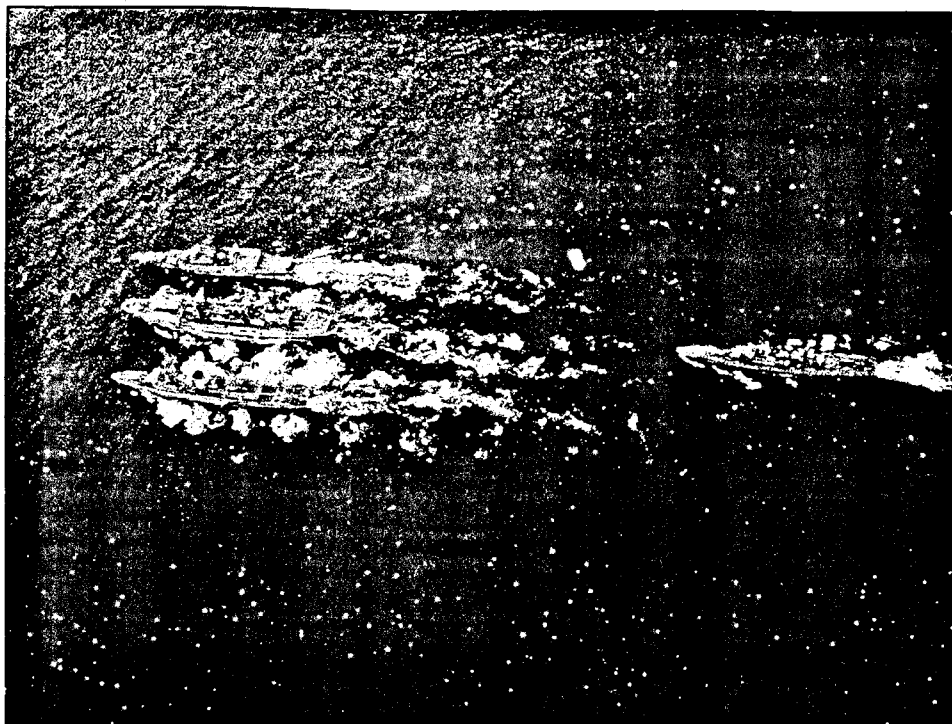
• 100,000 SHIPS TRANSIT THESE SEA LANES ANNUALLY

- HOSTING OF VARIOUS WORKSHOPS AND SEMINARS FOCUSING ON THE ISSUE OF MARITIME SECURITY,
- ARF WORKSHOP IN OCT 05 AT KOCHI ON 'TRAINING FOR COOPERATIVE MARITIME SECURITY'
- INDIA HAS A RICH TRACK RECORD IN TRAINING
- IN ALONE HAS TRAINED OVER 6700 PERSONNEL FROM 35 COUNTRIES
- CURRENTLY 235 PERSONNEL FROM 17 COUNTRIES ARE UNDERGOING TRAINING AT KOCHI ALONE
- THESE INTERACTIONS, HAVE BEEN VITAL INSTRUMENTS FOR ENHANCING UNDERSTANDING OF EACH OTHER'S CONCERNS AND CAPABILITIES

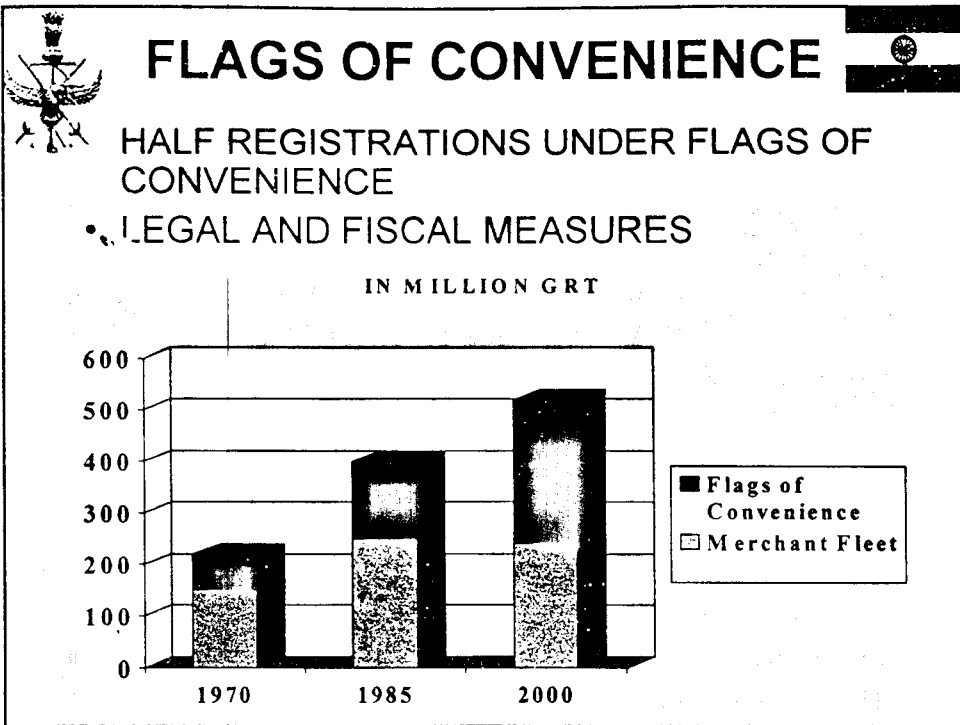

BASIC PRINCIPLES FOR PURSUING MARITIME SECURITY INITIATIVES

- FULL RESPECT FOR SOVEREIGNTY OF LITTORAL STATES
- MARITIME SECURITY IS A COMMON CAUSE
- CONSENSUAL AND COLLABORATIVE APPROACH IN ALL INITIATIVES AS PER INTERNATIONAL LAW
- COOPERATIVE RESPONSE IN THE EVENT OF NATURAL CALAMITIES OR MAJOR INCIDENT AT SEA



HYDROGRAPHIC ASSISTANCE

- FREEDOM OF NAVIGATION AFFECTED BY INSUFFICIENT HYDROGRAPHIC RESOURCES.
- NEED TO COOPERATE IN THIS FIELD TO HAVE UPDATED SURVEY DATA AVAILABLE FOR USE BY ALL SEA FARERS
- SURVEY AFTER NATURAL CALAMITIES LIKE EPICENTER SURVEY AFTER TSUNAMI
- INDIA WILLING TO OFFER ITS RESOURCES FOR THIS CAUSE TO ARF STATES



TRAINING OF MARITIME COMMUNITY



- DIFFERENT STATES HAVE DIFFERENT FIELDS OF SPECIALISATION
- NEED FOR GREATER ACCESS TO SUCH ADVANCES
- IN KEEPING WITH ARF STATEMENT ON "COOPERATION AGAINST PIRACY AND OTHER THREATS TO MARITIME SECURITY" OF JUN 2003, MENTIONING THE COMMITMENT MADE TO INSTITUTE REGIONAL COOPERATION IN TRAINING, THE ARF WORKSHOP IN KOCHI (INDIA) ADDRESSED THIS ISSUE.
- REPORT INCLUDED THE POSSIBILITY OF EXAMINING AND FURTHER DEVELOPING THE INDIAN SPONSORED PROPOSAL OF ESTABLISHING A REGIONAL MARITIME TRAINING CENTRE.
- IN THE ARF WORKSHOP AT TOKYO IN DECEMBER 2005, IT WAS DECIDED TO FURTHER EXPLORE AND IMPLEMENT THE SUGGESTION.
- ESTABLISHING A REGIONAL CENTRE FOR MARITIME TRAINING
 - FORM THE NUCLEUS FOR COORDINATING ALL TRAINING EFFORTS
 - REPOSITORY FOR ALL INFORMATION RELATED TO MARITIME TRAINING
