HACCAM'S HISTORIES

1ST HACCAM : TOKYO, JAPAN → 24TH JUNE, 2004

- TO MEASURES AGAINST PIRACY AND MARITIME TERRORISM
- TO THE HANDLING OF ACCIDENTS
- INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AND COORDINATION ON RESPONSE SYSTEMS FOR ACCIDENTAL SPILLS OF HAZARDOUS LIQUID SUBSTANCES AND OTHER DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES ON THE OCEAN MUST BE STRENGTHENED

2ND HACCAM : PUTRAJAYA, MALAYSIA → 20TH-23TH MARCH, 2006

- TO RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF ENHANCING COUNTRIES' INITIATIVES IN ADDRESSING AND ENFORCING MARITIME SECURITY ISSUES.
- TO PROMOTE GREATER COOPERATION AMONG PARTICIPANTS IN ADDRESSING AND ENFORCING MARITIME SECURITY INITIATIVES.
- TO SHARE IDEA AND IDENTIFY PRACTICAL MEASURES IN ADDRESSING MARITIME SECURITY ISSUES

3RD HACCAM : SINGAPORE → 24TH-25TH OCTOBER, 2007

- TO CAPACITY BUILDING IS A KEY CORNERSTONE OF COUNTER-TERRORISM COOPERATION AND WAS PARTICIPATED BY REGIONAL COUNTRIES INCLUDING ASEAN
- REINFORCED THE CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP AMONGST THE REGIONAL COAST GUARD AGENCIES TO ENSURE MARITIME SECURITY IN THE REGION.

4TH HACCAM : MANILA, PHILLIPINE → OCTOBER 2008

- TO COMBAT PIRACY AND ARMED ROBBERY AGAINST SHIPS IN THE ASIAN REGION
- TO STRENGTHEN EXISTING COOPERATION COVERING THE WHOLE RANGE OF MARITIME CONCERNS
- TO LEARN FROM THE SEVERAL CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED AND RESPONSES BY THE OTHER AGENCIES

MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE IN COOPERATION

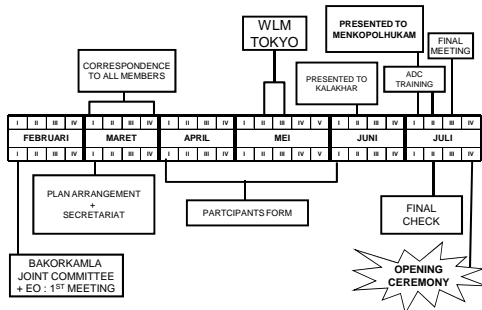
THE PARTIES, TO PROMOTE MUTUAL COOPERATION IN MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE, WILL GIVE DUE CONSIDERATION TO COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS, INCLUDING TO:

1. MUTUAL VISITS BETWEEN SEARCH AND RESCUE PERSONNEL;
2. CONDUCT OF JOINT EXERCISES OF SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS, AND OF TRAINING IN SEARCH AND RESCUE SERVICES;
3. USE OF SHIP REPORTING SYSTEMS FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE;
4. DEVELOPMENT OF SEARCH AND RESCUE PROCEDURES, TECHNIQUES, EQUIPMENT, AND FACILITIES; AND
5. PROVISION OF SERVICES IN SUPPORT OF SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS SUCH AS USE OF AIRCRAFT LANDING FIELDS, AND FUELING OR MEDICAL FACILITIES.

MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE IN OPERATION

1. THE SEARCH AND RESCUE POINT OF CONTACT FOR THE ASIAN COAST GUARD AGENCIES IS THE RESCUE COORDINATION CENTER AT EACH HEADQUARTERS
2. THE PARTIES UNDERTAKE TO REPORT TO EACH OTHER ON MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE CASES OF COMMON INTEREST WHEN NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE.
3. THE PARTIES UNDERTAKE TO KEEP EACH OTHER INFORMED IN A TIMELY AND EFFECTIVE MANNER ON SEARCH AND RESCUE CASES OF MUTUAL INTEREST, OR ON CASES WHICH COULD POTENTIALLY INVOLVE THE OTHER PARTY.
4. THE PARTIES AGREE TO EXCHANGE INFORMATION, IN ADDITION TO THAT RELATED TO SPECIFIC SEARCH AND RESCUE CASES, THAT MAY SERVE TO IMPROVE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS.
